A. <u>Letter of Support for USFS Grizzly Flat Community Fuel Break</u> – Mark Almer/Ernie Lory – Discussion/Action Item

Mark reported that the Forest Service sent the Grizzly Flats Fire Safe Council a letter of proposal to create a fuel break 1000 feet wide, up to 3000 acres along Capps Crossing and Leoni roads all the way to North South Road.

Mark Almer sent a letter of support from the GFFSC and to include a 1000-foot-wide fuel break around the entire Community of Grizzly Flats.

B. <u>Smokey Fire Hazard Severity Sign Purchase Authorization-</u> Mark Almer Discussion/Action Item

Robin made a **Motion** to accept the purchase of the sign presented, at a cost of \$3,290, with a second from Jennifer McKim. **Motion** passed.

## 13) Committee Reports

A. <u>Public Outreach Coordinator</u> – Deb Gregory

Deb reported the newsletter did not go out in April. She only received one image requested. She will publish in May with a different idea.

- B. <u>Defensible Space</u> Robin Kelley/Laurie Findlay/Liz Lawless/David Manske Robin reported they have not had a meeting. She stated that units eight and nine are not fire safe. She stated we need to educate this side of the Community. Ernie reported the El Dorado FSC seniors Defensible Space fund is closed but 5 members of Grizzly Flats applied and were approved.

Ernie reported that two properties are included in the Henry's Diggings project. The US Forest Service has put more money into projects and Grizzly Flats was given an additional \$150,000 by the US Forest Service. This money will be used for private land in units eight and nine.
